In February 2024, Graylon fell while riding his scooter and was complaining of not being able to put any weight on his leg. He was immediately

admitted to the ED where imaging revealed an abnormality in his leg bone which was later diagnosed as osteosarcoma. Graylon received multiple chemotherapies and a femoral resection to remove part of his leg. In October 2024, he received his prosthetic leg. Today, Graylon is an outgoing 8-year-old who loves dancing!

Alejandro, 14

Alejandro was a healthy, active kid when during a family gathering, he suddenly collapsed and went into

cardiac arrest at just 13 years old. His cousin immediately began CPR until the ambulance arrived. Once at the hospital, Alejandro was intubated in the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) and had a tracheostomy placed. He spent over three months in the hospital and also had a defibrillator placed. Today, Alejandro has made a full recovery and is a freshman in high school. His dream is to be a cardiologist when he grows up.



Insley had end stage renal failure due to an ischemic injury during birth (lack of oxygen). From April 2021 to July 2023, she was on

dialysis until she received her first kidney transplant. That kidney immediately failed due to a blood clot. In February 2024, Insley received her second kidney transplant from a family friend which was successful. Today, Insley is a normal, active 4-yearold who loves to sing and going to the beach!

Christopher, 2

Christopher was born at just 23 weeks and weighed just over one pound. He was a triplet, but lost his

brothers en utero. After birth, Christopher required extensive respiratory support. At five days old, he suffered a collapsed lung and stopped breathing. Even after so many obstacles and setbacks, Christopher got stronger every day. In December 2023, after a 206-day hospital stay, he was able to go home. Today, Christopher is two years old and loves music and dancing.

Owen, 1

Owen was born at 26 weeks. Despite his early gestational age, he was already crying and weighed only 2 pounds at birth. Owen

was immediately put on a ventilator to help him breathe. Eventually, he came down with viral meningitis but made a full recovery. After 86 days in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Owen was able to go home without oxygen and was feeding on his own. Today, he is hitting all milestones and is a happy, healthy 1-year-old.



Tay was admitted to the Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) with a diagnosis of RSV and the flu. Upon arrival, he was quickly intubated and had a chest tube placed. He


eventually developed necrotizing pneumonia and was cannulated to ECMO and dialysis because his heart, lungs and kidneys weren't doing what they needed to do. Tay spent 64 days in the hospital, including rehab to learn to walk and talk again. Today, Tay is four years old and loves Roblox, YouTube and terrorizing his siblings.
